On the first day of school, the students in 1 Violet enjoyed playing board games together and sharing their holiday experiences with each other, making it a fantastic start to the school year!




2 Lavender began their Initial-Lit program which addresses literacy instruction by providing strong foundations in reading and writing!

During their Personal and Health Development lesson, 3 Peony students delve into understanding positive relationships and friendships. What about a pizza party and some Gong Cha? 6 lvy was welcomed back with a party and were super excited to come back to school ready for their final year of schooling!




yourself healthy and who to turn to to discuss mental health issues.



#### Morning drop-off

To accommodate for many working parents, students are now welcome to be dropped off in the morning starting from 8am. A teacher has been assigned to this morning duty. No students will be allowed to enter school gates before 8am as there will be no supervision. Parents dropping their children between 8am - 8.20am must park outside and drop their children to the main playground area as the front gate duty will not commence until 8.20am. **No parents are to drive in, in the mornings.** 





#### Afternoon pick-up routine

The new pick-up routine will see all parents remain in their cars, whilst staff assist in bringing your children to you. Attached is an updated map of our school area; with details of where parents are expected to drive in, pick up their children and exit in an orderly fashion. Please do not arrive to enter the gates and wait in line before 2.30pm as this

may disrupt the movement for students between classes in alternate blocks. You are expected to drive in, all the way around the loop and staff will bring your children to your car, once you reach the pick-up gates. There will be multiple staff around the loop asking for your children's names, so that staff can

prepare your child to get in the car upon your arrival. Once your children are in your

car, please move along towards the exit, promptly, to ease the traffic flow. If for any reason, you need to exit your car or see the Admin at the Office, please consider please

consider parking outside and walking in. Otherwise, parking on site may see your exit delayed due to stationary traffic around the loop.



### ZAHRA GRAMMAR SCHOOL School Uniform





#### A day here and there doesn't seem like much, but...



We ask parents to avoid taking leave during the learning semesters. Every day missed, accumulates to vital learning time which is eventually lost and unable to be compensated. No more than a total of 10 days of leave will be approved without an urgent or acceptable reason.

#### **Late School Arrivals**

Arriving to school late regularly, means that your child misses out on significant morning routines and ROTE learning which may severely affect their learning. This also disrupts the class and teacher's morning structure.

Students who arrive late three times consecutively in one week, will receive a warning notice. Three Late Arrival notices will escalate so that parents meet with Executives, and may lead to the termination of your child's enrolment.

By ensuring your child arrives to school on time, you are working with us to build up skills where they learn to be punctual and responsible for their choices and time control.
